After almost seven years since the Construction General Permit (CGP) for stormwater discharges was last renewed in 2010, a body of information has been collected documenting common enforcement issues and corrective actions at job sites in California. Fundamental to compliance is maintaining awareness of permit implementation requirements.

The emphasis of this training class is to present the most common enforcement issues and actions and how to correct problems or prevent them altogether. In addition, this class will provide students with an update on important areas of emphasis identified by the State and Regional Water Boards, such as stepped-up scrutiny of the Notice of Termination (NOT) process and paperwork, and using the latest tools and technologies to complete the NOT process and obtain Regional Board approval.

Essential Permit Implementation Practices and Procedures – Avoiding Common Mistakes and Taking Corrective Actions -- Responding to Inspections and Audits and Enforcement Actions is a 4-hour continuing education class designed for construction site stormwater professionals who have to maintain compliance with CGP training requirements.

This training class provides 4 hours of continuing education credits (4 Professional Development Units—PDUs) suitable for meeting CGP training, certification, and continuing education requirements.

The construction site compliance training class series is being offered to specifically address CGP training requirements that site personnel receive adequate training on permit content and, that personnel demonstrate on-going attainment of continuing education credits.

Seminar content and contact time is sufficient for students to use in meeting CPSWQ, CPESC, CESSWI and CISEC continuing education credits which must be maintained by qualified SWPPP practitioners (QSPs) and developers (QSDs).
